MEDICO LEGAL EXPERIENCE

Report Writing:

Ten years of medico-legal experience and over the last ten years has prepared over 600 medico-legal reports.

The reports have a fast turnaround time, are usually prepared within 14 days of seeing the patient. Reports are always clearly written and well presented, receiving positive feedback from both patients and lawyers. I am working as an Emergency Physician on a full-time basis. I had ten years experience in preparing reports for injury related legal claims. Working from three sites around Dartford, producing more than 100 reports per annum. The case mix includes personal injury claims including motor and industrial injuries, repetitive strain injuries and medical negligence claims.

There is a short turnaround time for producing reports. The typical time for preparing a routine medico-legal report once the client has been seen is 45-60 minutes. The report is sent out from the office within 14 days after seeing the client. All reports are extremely clearly presented. Reports are always clearly written and well presented, receiving positive feedback from both patients and lawyers. The split between claimant and defendant is 80/20. Medical negligence reports (Liability and/or causation) Condition and/or Prognosis reports are dealt with appropriately.

Waiting time for appointments is at present 2 to 4 weeks.

PRESENT APPOINTMENT Consultant Emergency Medicine:

I was appointed as a **Substantive Consultant** in Emergency Medicine, Darent Valley Hospital, Dartford, Kent since Mar 1st,20 08. This hospital is modern, at the forefront of quality health care provision to a catchments area of 300,000+.

Darent Valley Hospital opened in September 2000 and is a modern state-of-theart hospital located in the Southeast of England, built for the 21st Century. The hospital provides an extensive range of acute, mainly hospital-based health services to the local community and neighbouring districts.

Emergency Department is currently **staffed** by 5 Consultants, 11 middle grades, 8 Senior House Officers. We see about 55,000 new patients per annum covering a wide range of conditions seen in a standard District General Hospital Emergency Department. The staff grade provides 24-hour middle grade cover and supervision for SHOs. A trauma team has been set up to deal with major trauma which is led by the ED consultant. There is a Hospital based Cardiac Arrest Team, which responds to cardiac arrests in the A&E Department.

Duties include providing **leadership**, supervision, assessment, resuscitation, diagnosis and initial treatment of all emergency patients with a responsibility for the appropriate transfer to other departments. Provide out of hours **on call cover** on rota basis covering both hospitals (1: 4). The

responsibility also encompasses professional supervision of junior staff, developing sense of reliability, team work and motivation.

Managerial duties include involvement in developing policies/ procedures (Departmental & Hospital). The recruitment of staff, development of professional relationship with colleagues and other staff are vital part of the job.

Audit as a tool for Clinical governance and risk management is essential. The complaints are dealt as per trusts procedure and protocols. Attendance at monthly medical staff meetings is essential.
