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Summary of UK Experience & Posts held

I have worked in the UK for 20 years, initially I trained as a Surgeon. I changed to Emergency Medicine (A&E)

Medicine in 1997, and completed the Specialist Training in 2003, and took up my appointment as a Consultant the same year.

I have written Medicolegal Reports for the last 11 years, and I am a member of the Registration Council of Medical Experts.

I developed a special interest in Focused Bedside Ultrasound (Bedside Emergency Ultrasound), and went on to do a 1 year fellowship at King's College London. I run training courses for the College of Emergency Medicine, and have presented internationally, including Brazil & Nigeria (WACS 2010), Transforming Emergency Care in Nigeria June 2009. I use ultrasound in my day to day practice, as an extension of the physical examination, and I am very adept at Ultrasound-guided procedures.

I train on a number of Life Support Courses, including ALS(ACLS), ALERT (Acute & Life-threatening illness Early Recognition & Treatment..

I was the Undergraduate Tutor for the Medical students from UCL, and Regional Clinical Sub-Dean University of Cambridge Medical School, till I took a sabbatical in May 2010. I was also Medical Lead for Acute Medicine University of Hertfordshire (Physicians Assistant programme), till I went on sabbatical in Nigeria for a year in May 2010.

I took a 12-month sabbatical in a Nigerian University Teaching Hospital from May 2010 — May 2011. We set up the Teaching Hospital from scratch, and I modelled the Emergency Department along the lines that we have in the UK.

This has lead to the recognition of the need for Emergency Medicine as a Specialty in Nigeria, and I have since been invited by the West African College of Surgeons and the Ministry of Health to give advice on Emergency Medicine as a sub-specialty, and as a contributor to the Medical aspect of a National Emergency Response "Think Tank."
